e are the Old Strathcona Business Association, the Business Improvement Area (BIA) for this district. The City of Edmonton defines BIAs as:

A Business Improvement Area (BIA) is a specific geographic area of the city in which businesses pool resources and work together, through a formal association, to enhance the economic development of their area.

The point is to help create vibrant economies across the City of Edmonton, and we do so by working with you (and more than 600 of your new neighbours) to remove barriers and create opportunities for businesses such as yours to succeed. All the businesses in this area contribute a levy which we allocate to pursue numerous initiatives to influence and improve the environment our businesses operate in. The OSBA is guided by a Board of Directors - made up of business owners like you!

We have a small but mighty staff, and we are constantly working on a number of projects including:

- Neighbourhood beautification, including flowers, murals, and other public art projects in the area.
- Social Enterprise partnerships with a variety of Edmonton organizations to support neighbourhood clean-up initiatives.
- Advocacy for programs like the Storefront and Alley Improvement grant, Development Incentive grant, COVID Economic Relief programs and patio permits.
- Collective marketing initiatives that encourage supporting local businesses, bring awareness to Old Strathcona as a shopping destination and highlight our business owners.
- Area activation and public-attention programming delivered through shopping events and campaigns like

our Sweet Treats and Latte Festival, and Winter Whyte Light Up.

- Support and partnership of community events and festivals that drive traffic to the area.
- Improving the overall pedestrian and visitor experience with public space enhancements like seating, parklets and patio activation.

We are also your conduit for accessing information and resources from the City of Edmonton, such as:

- Help navigating business licensing and permitting
- Ongoing advocacy for neighbourhood improvements and other interests of our businesses.

Cleanliness & Beautification



Flowers, murals, public art projects and general neighbourhood clean-up partnerships.



Storefront maintenance, including winter shovelling, summer sweeping, window washing and graffiti removal.

Work together with the Neighbourhood Empowerment Team (NET), the EPS Beats team, businesses, and others to provide support and access to resources.



Reporting to 311, building relationships with neighbouring businesses, and being familiar with the City of Edmonton's neighbourhood response tool.

Active social media channels. digital shop local campaigns, sponsorships, neighbourhood events.



Connecting with us when you have a marketing initiative, by tagging us on social media, engaging with our social media, and reaching out to us with your marketing plans and ideas.

Member newsletter, in person visits, building connections within the business owner community.



Building relationships with your neighbours, engaging and participating or sponsoring neighbourhood events and festivals, creating and participating in cross-promotional programs with other businesses.
