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1.0 INTRODUCTION

In September of 2014 Canadian Pacific Railways removed the tracks and equipment at the railway crossing on Whyte Avenue between 102nd Street and Gateway Boulevard. At the time IBI Group approached the Old Strathcona Business Association and the Old Strathcona Foundation about developing this area this area into park space. The original suggested scope for this project was the area adjacent to Whyte Avenue where the tracks were removed. Over several weeks of discussions the scope evolved to be the area just south of Whyte Avenue and north to Saskatchewan Drive.

2. PROJECT GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

There were specific requirements identified for the successful achievement of the project. These included:

- Provide the community of Old Strathcona through their various community groups and associations with a set of rendered layout drawings and perspectives that would explain the desired direction for this community amenity
- Create an outdoor "people place" market / entertainment/ festival venue
- Design for people not for cars
- Strengthen the north south pedestrian and bicycle connection
- Further develop green fingers connections to adjacent neighbourhoods
- The design should incorporate appropriate environmental and geotechnical input
